

Grammar: Past Simple

We use the past tense to talk about something that happened in the past.

With most verbs, the past tense is formed by adding -ed

call - called like- liked want-wanted work - worked

But there are a lot of irregular past tense forms in English. Here are the most common irregular verbs in English, with their past tense forms:

Base form	Past tense	Base form	Past tense
be	was/were	give	Gave
begin	began	go	Went
bring	brought	have	Had
buy	bought	know	Knew
come	came	make	Made
do	did	meet	Met
eat	ate	say	Said
get	got	tell	Told

We use did to make questions with the past simple. We use didn't (did not) to make negatives with the past simple.

We got home late yesterday. Did we get home late yesterday? We didn't get home late yesterday. They lived in Spain ten years ago. Did they live in Spain ten years ago. They didn't live in Spain ten years ago.




